<p><b>2) Cultures.</b> The student gains knowledge and understanding of other cultures. The student is expected to:</p> <p>(A) use the language at the intermediate proficiency level to demonstrate an understanding of the practices (what people do) and how they are related to the perspectives (how people perceive things) of the cultures studied; and</p> <p>(B) use the language at the intermediate proficiency level to demonstrate an understanding of the products (what people create) and how they are related to the perspectives (how people perceive things) of the cultures studied.</p>	<p>Movie theaters in Russia</p>	<p>Is there anything about Russian movie theater etiquette that an American might find awkward?</p>

<p><b>3) Connections.</b> The student uses the language to make connections with other subject areas and to acquire information. The student is expected to:</p> <p>(A) use resources (that may include technology) in the language and cultures being studied at the intermediate proficiency level to gain access to information; and</p> <p>(B) use the language at the intermediate proficiency level to obtain, reinforce, or expand knowledge of other subject areas.</p>	<p>Reading television and movie schedules</p>	<p>Do Russians have the same choices of television programs and movies as Americans?</p>
<p><b>4) Comparisons.</b> The student develops insight into the nature of language and culture by comparing the student's own language and culture to another. The student is expected to:</p> <p>(A) use the language at the intermediate proficiency level to demonstrate an understanding of the nature of language through comparisons of the student's own language and the language studied; and</p> <p>(B) use the language at the intermediate proficiency level to demonstrate an understanding of the concept of culture through comparisons of the student's own culture and the cultures studied; and</p> <p>(C) use the language at the intermediate proficiency level to demonstrate an understanding of the influence of one language and culture on another.</p>	<p>Talking about movies and television</p>	<p>Do you think there are Russians and Americans who share the same movie and television interests?</p>
