VIII. Celebrations

- a. The MISD DECA chapter earned top awards at the organization's state competition held March 11-12. Three students placed second in the state, another four are advancing to internationals, and the group was named Chapter of the Year.
- b. Our first all-district symphony orchestra was held last week
- c. A new P-TECH (Pathways in Technology Early College High Schools) academy will open at Summit High School in August of 2024.

d. In a P-TECH program, students earn a high school diploma, an industry-recognized associate degree, and gain relevant work experience in a growing field. Summit High School's P-TECH Academy will open with an inaugural class of 50 freshmen. The students will attend the school-within-a-school for their entire high school career and will benefit from guidance and real-world instruction with business partner, Mouser Electronics.

e. For the tenth year in a row, Mansfield ISD has earned one of the highest recognitions given by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The district received the 2023 ENERGY STAR Partner of the Year—Sustained Excellence Award. Winners are selected from a network of thousands of ENERGY STAR partners. The Partner of the Year Award is given to entities that perform at a superior level of energy management and prove organization-wide energy savings. The Sustained Excellence designation is given to organizations that have already received ENERGY STAR Partner of the Year recognition for a minimum of two consecutive years.

f. For the first time, Mansfield ISD has been named to Forbes' list of America's Best Midsize Employers. MISD has been recognized as one of Forbes' best-in-state employers three years in a row, but this is the first time the district has received national distinction. MISD joins the top 1% of employers across the nation who received the prestigious recognition.
