Will there be an option for virtual learning for PreK?

No, virtual learning is only for students in Grades K-6

Why is there no virtual learning for PreK students?

Currently, the virtual option will be available to students in kindergarten through sixth grade only (K-6), as virtual learning in PK is not developmentally appropriate and PK is not a required grade level for all students.

When do PreK students start school?

Students who are enrolled in Pre-K will start school in-person Wednesday, August 18th.

How many kids are in a PreK classroom?

A maximum of 22 students will be with two teachers in a room.

What are the health and safety protocols for PreK students?

Do students and staff wear masks?

We do not mandate students and/or staff to wear masks. It is encouraged and an option for all.

Will PreK students be kept 6 ft apart?

We will follow MISD guidelines for Health and Safety Protocols at all times. We will teach and encourage students to wash their hands. Spaces will be cleaned and disinfected. Students will be encouraged to distance themselves when necessary.

Can I keep my child home until I feel comfortable sending him to school?

Yes, of course. As much as we want your child to be on campus to learn with us, we respect your decision to keep your child home. However, you must un-enroll your child and re-enroll when you are ready for him to return.

Can I have the PreK seat saved for my child after I un-enroll?

Unfortunately, no. We are unable to save a seat for your child.

What do I do if my child has COVID or a family member has COVID?

If your child has COVID, we ask that you notify the school immediately. We would ask that you keep your child home for ten days (the days begin on the first day symptoms started). If a family member has COVID, your child may attend school if your child does not have symptoms.

Would my child be provided with virtual learning for the days he is at home sick?

Your child will not be provided with virtual learning during the duration he is at home due to COVID. We would want him to get lots of rest to feel better and return to campus feeling well.

What about all the things he will miss because he is absent?

We will provide your child with opportunities to learn things missed while he was out.
